


In the 5000, Cochrane finished in 15.28; Facey in 16.22 and again John Cornock took things easy with a snail's 16.23.

Veteran athlete, political commentator (wee after all, what are the O.Games really about?), finance wizard, and part-time esoteric humorist Dick Batchelor claims that:

HISTORY REPEATS ITSELF (i)

" On December 1, 1956, before many of our members were born, the world's top marathon runners headed away from the MCG towards St. Kilda Junction, from where they would continue out along Dandenong Rd. to the "turn" near where Sandown is now situated. The course was marked with a broken line of green paint, which was still visible in parts a decade later!

A late afternoon start was chosen but the day was still scorching hot, well into the eighties Fahrenheit, when the field set off on their chase for the Olympic title. Defending the title he won at Helsinki in 1952 was the great Czech Emil Zatopek, whose "grand slam" at those Games (he also won the 5000m and the 10,000m) will probably never be repeated.

However, the Melbourne ~~10k~~ race was won by a very tough little 36 year old French-Algerian named Alain Mimoun-okcha (according to athletics archivist Bruce Hooley - for our purposes he will be called 'Mr. A'), who had won three silver medals on the track in the 1948 and 1952 Olympics, being beaten on each occasion by Zatopek. After completing his final lap of the MCG and breaking the tape in 2:25.00 Mimoun waved away photographers and waited until Zatopek arrived in sixth place, and Mimoun could embrace his old rival and friend.

Twenty three years later the 5000 starters in the 1979 Big M Melbourne Marathon faced similar conditions which everyone dreaded---heat (23°C at 4.00pm) and a strong southerly. I followed the race by car and it was already uncomfortably hot at Epsomton before the 9.00 am start.

The enormous field got away quickly. At Mordialloc we waited for the leaders to appear. Holding a hundred metre break on the leading pack was Horst Wegner, a German non resident in Sydney. Jim Langford from Perth (who later pulled out), Eric Sigmant and the NSW pair Brian Morgan and Andrew Lloyd were also well placed, while the APSOB contingent was led by Peter Bruce of Old Xavier, ending a five year absence from marathon races. As expected Andrew Lloyd passed Wegner and cleared away to reach the Melbourne Town Hall in 2:26.44, 1½ minutes slower than Mimoun's 1956 time. Wegner was second in 2:31.20 with Brian Morgan third in 2:32.09.

Old Scotch's entrants went very well. Andy Ramsay showed a glimpse of his considerable talent by recording his first marathon finish in just under 3 hours--- equivalent at least to 2:45 in "normal" conditions. Charlie Aitken and Paul Brag made it back from Sunday morning Training stroll to finish in close proximity in around 3½ hours. Mike Caraher put in a gutsy effort to record 3:41 and John Herbert, after an injury-plagued winter, made it in a meritorious 3:53. Ian Hickey withdrew at Moorabin and in his first attempt at the 26 miler, John Holmes finished in a creditable 3:56. Stewart Souders, currently on lease to Glenhuntly for a few years to boost their stocks, whipped through the first 10 miles in 55 minutes (try it some time) and then eased back a couple of notches to cross the line in the first forty in around 2:51. Peter Bruce apparently 'blew up' and finished well over three hours, so it seems that the honours of first APSOB goes to Andrew Ramsay esq.

By the way, whatever happened to Mimoun and Zatopek? The former still competes occasionally (fast!) in veteran athletics and holds a number of age group world records (e.g. the 10,000 meters, aged 52, 32 minutes, 36 seconds). Zatopek was a supporter of the liberal Dubcek government in Czechoslovakia in the late 1960s and disappeared from view when it was overthrown with the assistance of a Russian tank division. He has surfaced again in recent years and is an honoured guest at many major European athletics meetings.

Wonder if any of those green line are still around? "

An excellent wine for immediate drinking and will develop with bottle age. This wine has won a bronze medal in the 1979 Perth Show.

2. 1979 Stanley Leasingham Bin 6 Mozel

A light delicate fresh wine. Made entirely from Rhine Riesling grapes grown mainly at the Leasingham Winery in South Australia's Clare Valley showing typical flowery and spicy character on nose and palates combined with slight sweetness and crisp acidity. This wine, although ready to drink now, should continue to improve in bottles for many years.

3. Stanley Leasingham Hutt Creek Claret

a beginners' guide to FOREIGN AFFAIRS

A new occasional, provocative feature by a special writer. This week, "The Russians are coming! "

As we look around the world at the start of another year - not a new decade, incidentally, which doesn't begin until next year - we find, to our profound horror, that the Russians are on our doorstep again. Well, almost. In fact, they're now in Afghanistan, some 8000 miles away, but it's the principle which counts. With the Russians now poised to invade Pakistan - possibly to forestall a similar foray by Australian cricketers; Ayatollah Khomeiny, the mad mullah of Qum, pronounced Kom(sic), still holding his hostages in Tehran, and Indira Gandhi, newly re-elected dictator, sharpening her knives in India - all things considered, our part of the world is in pretty poor shape.

This is not really new, of course, and neither is the response to it all. Particularly characteristic was that of Jimmy Carter who, with that quintessential helplessness which has become the hallmark of his presidency, announced measures designed to hurt, not the Russians - Heaven forbid! - but the Americans: "Let's use our money to prop up another unsavoury ~~xxx~~ dictatorship (this time in Pakistan), and earn the contempt we deserve."

But then, what can we do? How can we register our displeasure with the Russians? This is where the athletes come in with the ideal solution - a mass boycott of the Moscow Olympics. Unfortunately, most can mouth only, somewhat pathetically, "keep politics out of sport." An admirable sentiment indeed, but one which few have bothered to think out logically. For it must mean the end of all government funding of sport - how can athletes be independent of they depend on the politicians for a living? Could the Olympics, indeed, survive at all - having ~~xx~~ become as they have a contest between governments, that is, between rival gangs of politicians?

Clearly then, the government must act now, and withdraw all finance and support from the Olympic government. This could be construed as a gesture of opposition to the Russians, or of support for sporting independence. Either way, the effect will be the same. Moscow will be finished, and the Olympics will be back where they belong - in the province of harmless, independent, apolitical, and penniless sports characters.

Ed: to those who question the right of such political comment to occupy space in the club's news-sheet, I reply that it our duty, nay, our obligation, to contribute to the discussion ~~XXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXX~~ of an issue which relates directly to the governing body of Australian athletics X; we must tell 'em what we think and not merely allow the Ron Clarkes of the country to formulate policy without canvassing opinion at the grassroots levels etc. etc. rhubarb rhubarb.

FOREIGN AFFAIRS FOR TINY-TOTS by a correspondent who is foreign to us all, namely Charles Richardson, defender of the faith and fearless freedom-fighter.

" F.A. and other diversions. This week, A Report from Afar."

HOBART, Sun Feb 3: Tasmania is a great place for a holiday, but, I must say, a lousy one for athletes. There is not a single stretch of level ground anywhere in Hobart - nothing but hills in every direction. Not being a running person myself, I have not been unduly worried; instead, my casual thoughts have turned to politics.

News is that Malcolm Fraser - 'Big M' to his friends (if he has any) - is planning an early election on the issue of foreign affairs; specifically, on the defence of Australia against the Russian threat. In Hobart, one is very conscious of such a threat; everywhere there are military institutions built to guard the township against the great Slavonic Bear. Unfortunately for Big M, he is eighty years too late. The Russians may have been threatening Australia, or at least Tasmania, in the 1890s, but they have not reappeared in our vicinity since. Worse still, much of the electorate is smart enough to realise this.

Of course Big M will still win the next election, whenever he chooses to hold it. In fact, it is inconceivable that a party led by Bill Hayden could ever win any election anywhere. But the Liberals' huge majority can only be endangered by a premature election - people will always resent being called to the polls early, particularly over frivolous issues. And for most Australians, anything in Foreign Affairs is frivolous. The vast majority have no real notion of where Afghanistan is, much less why the Russians are there. Have you?

None of this, of course, means that we should be feeble in our reprisals against the Russians, only that we should be selective. The best measure remains a boycott of the Moscow Olympics, which will hit Russian public opinion hardest. But obviously we are also justified in withholding supplies of, say, strategic metals - which go to the making of missiles aimed at us. This will not free the Afghans, who may be better off under the Russians' domination anyway. But someone must make a stand now. It's the principle which counts.


