MINUTES: Having been circulated, the minutes of the meeting held on September 1st were confirmed as a true record.

BUSINESS ARISING: Masthead C. Findlay reported that ten reams of a new style had been printed. No account presented as yet.

CORRESPONDENCE: VAAA "Change in Registration fees to \$6 and \$4 for Seniors and Juniors respectively;" also re coaching and other matters - passed on to appropriate committee members.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

- (1) Statement of Receipts and payments for September was received and accounts totalling \$83.20 were passed for payment.
- (2) Special Effort. The club gained approximately \$160 (from which expenses are to be deducted).
- (3) Outstanding Debts. S. Hare drew the committee's attention to the amount of \$158.15 of outstanding debts as at March 31, 1975. This was after \$66 being written off as bad debts in November 1974. Of the remaining debts, a substantial amount is still outstanding. Resolved: Sub-committee of S. Hare and S. Facey to be formed to check each outstanding debt and recommend action to the next committee meeting. In order to reduce the problem in future it was further resolved: any member guaranteeing payment of subscription by a prospective member shall be required to pay that subscription himself if payment cannot be obtained from the latter.
- (4) Subscriptions. As from October 19, 1975 it was agreed that subscriptions should be as follows:

(Social membership shall include those members who compete only in winter season and not in VAAA).

This increase was forced by the increase in VAAA registration fees (see Correspondence). It was further agreed that the club pay the \$62-00 (backdated registration fees) to VAAA; it is to be suggested, via the news-sheet, that this payment could be recouped by donations from those members to whom the payment relates. It was resolved that an explanation of the increase in subscriptions be made to the AGM.

Under dark clouds and blustery conditions , sub-junior got off to a flying start beating Old Carey by 38 points. Despite the delayed start, with no pole vaulter or walker the team was soon back in the running with an excellent set of 100m runs. Al McLeish was 1st in a time of 11.2, Bill Fleming 2nd with 11.7 and Nick Tapp 3rd. with 11.8 ...all PB's. Schloeffel surprised the spectators with a 100m run in a time of 13.9-- his PB by 1.0 sec. Plaisted and Ekberg also ran well. Jim Morey and Geoff Little ran 1500's with Morey getting a PB of 4-28.9 .

The 110m hurdles was next with Nick Tapp and Dave Ekberg both getting PB's . Dave won in a time of 17.3 with Nick 17.6. Dave Schloeffel had a convincing win in the shot put with 12.09m while Bill Fleming won the triple jump (convincingly?) by 1.0cm. with a jump of 10.98m.

In the 4x200m relay , a team of Tapp , Plaisted, Fleming and McLeish won by 80m with a time of 1-36.9, while an invitation team of Ekberg, Schlef, Little and Roach were disqualified , unfortunately by a misguided judge. In the discus it took Dave Schloeffel 3 throws to qualify , with a throw of 19.14m , giving him a walkover win. Jim Morey got a club record in the 1500m steeple with 4-59.5 and Geoff Little followed closely behind him .

To finish off a good day , Bill Fleming won the 400m with 56.5, Jim Morey 2nd. 56.8 and Nick Tapp 58.1 . The invitation team of Plaisted, Ekberg and Schloeffel came in that order. .

TEAM SELECTION POLICY FOR DISTANCE EVENTS SENIOR GRADES

At last count the old Scotch distance squad consisted of 22 athletes. The events which these athletes cover are 800, 1500, 5000 & 3000 Steeple. If no-one doubles up a maximum of 15 athletes can compete for the club on any one week.

The aim of the club is to give everyone who wishes, a run. This will necessitate a number of runners to run by invitation each week. To make sure everyone qualifies to run in the finals (very good chance of all three teams making them), there will be no doubling up unless by doing so changes a possible defeat into a win. Likewise teams may not necessarily be selected strictly upon form, but rather to make sure everyone has the chance to represent the club. McLeish was too good. Did Grog do the long jump?

Honours to OS after the 300. Tom took the initiative and was leading into the final straight but no-one was making any headway on him until the last 50 metres when Rog Tallent evidently realised he could win the race and came home with a massive finishing burst to hit the tape ...just. A great effort by both runners. Graham Wise was in close pursuit until the last 120 metres and even at Windy Hollow clocked a credible 1-59.6 although he was not particularly thrilled was overheard to be pleasantly satisfied. Mal MacFarlane, after a wild dash from the airport jumped to qualify, and full points . The relay as expected romped in and Ric Liebmann without opposing pressure followed the relay's example. Sub-Junior Versus Ivanhoe 2.



Since everyone knows the outcome of December 13 it would be pointless for me to add to the multitude of facts and figures, to say nothing of the large amount of commentary from the newspapers. And, if you are still left in the dark, there are certain to be books published on it later. (This is really a lot of bullshit, because the original team report was unfortunately misplaced— Lies. It was lost. But, anyway, here are the results—

SUB-JUNIOR (Libs.) (CIA and the multi-nationals) VERSUS IVANHOE 2 (Labor) (Chinese hordes and 200 ft. snakes)



ANDREW GRAHAM KELSO

Upon arriving at Scotch in 1966 Andy quickly established himself as the top distance runner in his age-group , a distinction that he maintained throughout his school career . During this period he recorded many fine victories in A.P.S. cross-country races . He won the school U15 cross-country race for two successive years . He ran a very close second in the U15 Victorian Schoolboys Championships on the gruelling Coburg course . On the track he established a school U16 mile record (4-44.6) . In his final year at school he was elected Captain of Cross-country . His quiet , humble leadership and great personal performances inspired many lesser runners to reach greater heights .

As a scout Andy's leadership qualities were also recognised . It was here that he developed his love for the bush and its associated activities .

Andy highlighted his running career at Scotch with a great run in the 3000 m at the Combined Sports (second in 9-12.4) . Following this exhausting run in very hot conditions he fronted up an hour later to run a very strong first leg in the 4x800 m relay .

Always in the top academic bracket , Andy gained a very good H.S.C. and commenced a forestry course at Melbourne University . Constantly searching for new and greater challenges , he became an active member of several University clubs . He further developed his interests in ecologg and outdoor activities .

Andy's running continued to improve . On the track he was competing in A grade for Old Scotch in both the steeple and 5000 m . That year he established a club U19 5000 m record (15-28.2) . He was one of the top Old Scotch cross-country runners . He was twice selected to run in intervarsity cross-country . Twice he completed the most gruelling athletic challenge , the marathon , in very creditable times.

To his friends he was known as a man of action rather than words . He possessed a very quick and subtle sense of humour . A deep thinker , he had a great passion for literature and could express his inner feelings through poetry .

What a day! All opposing athletes, officials and spectators saw last Saturday at Heidelberg was red, red and more red. Five teams represented Old Scotch and four of them coasted in for powerful, crushing wins. B grade (soon to be A grade) won by 84 points (not bad), C grade (soon to be B grade) won by 34 points, D grade (soon C) by 48 points and U14 by 38 points. The sub-juniors were handicapped by rowing and injuries and had to be happy with third place for the year.

IF YOU ARE SELECTED THIS WEEK BUT ARE UNAVAILABLE INFORM YOUR TEAM CAPTAIN IMMEDIATELY, NOW AND AT ONCE. This will help to save Gregor from developing ulcers and a heart condition.

In addition, ALL selected athletes MUST be at Olympic Park at least twenty minutes (preferably half an hour) before the start of their event. They should report to Greg, Ro or Mark P. (hey, that's me) the minute they hit Olympic Park. Certain runners made things very difficult for us last time by arriving less than five minutes before their event. Excuses such as "Oh, I thought Fred would tell you I'd be late" don't really help much at all.

If we were super-keen, we would order everyone to turn up at one o'clock to support our athletes in the early events. But better was to come in the 800m. Rog's heat time was 1-56 and his semi-final time a very fast 1-50.9. In the final on Sunday Rog was drawn in an outside lane (as usual). A typical Tallent finish saw Rog pass several big names to finish third in a brilliant 1-48.7, a PB by 2.2 seconds and a club record. Not bad!

Another star during the championships was former OS high jumper, John Knight. John finished second to Peckham with a mighty leap of 2.10m (about 6'11"). Believe it or not, John is still a junior. His attempt at 7'0" was oh so very close.

Results at the inter-venue meeting were most impressive. Besides Tallent's PB 400m, John Marx and Stew Handasyde both recorded PB 1500m times of around 3-58. Euan did 3-49, Graham Wise 3-59 and Andy Cochrane 4-07. Under 14 freak David Edwards created more work for the records boys by shot-putting 12.60m (PB and REC) and hurdling in 13.2 (eq PB and eq REC). 1500m and the tide had begun to turn. Star Even dashed through the last lap to a win (3-49), leaving your correspondent (Stew H.) in his wake, 7th in 3-56 (PB) and Andy Cochrane 8th 3-59. Then the relay - after losing the individual events, the sprinters threw in Rog Tallent and streaked to a great win AND club record 1-27.8. John Marx a dashing win over the steeple fences in 9-24. As the first two sentences of this letter show, many athletes might be pleasantly surprised with the results.


