## COMBINED SPORTS REPORT

Scotch had a great 93½ point win at the Combined, one of the biggest winning margins ever, with the highest total score ever, 380 points, and the first time that any school has made all First Division finals. Overall, the team gained 9 firsts, 12 seconds and 6 thirds out of the 382 event

In the sprints, Simon Tallent, Vice Captain, ran 11.4 secs in the open 100m for 3rd, and 22.8 secs for 2nd in the 200m behind Kostos of Carey, for 2nd place; his previous best 400m time was over 52 secs, but he stuck behind Kostos all the way.

In U 17, Cameron Mc Conchie, who was a bit too nervous to run his best, gained second in both events to Kinna of Xavier. In the 100m, after a bad start, he fought back to catch the Xavier boy, but just lost at the finish, both in 11.3 secs. In the 200m, he hit the straight first but faded a bit, both again running 22.7 secs.

Cameron won the long jump with 20' 11½", and was in the record breaking U 17 relay, and ran 6th in the 400m in 52.3 secs.

U 16 Geoff Bell got a magnificent start in his 100m, and held on to win in 11.5 secs. He won the hurdles in record time of 12.6 secs., and ran 2nd in the 200m in 23.4 secs.

The U 15 sprinters were not quite as strong, but Peter Brown took 3rd place in 12.3 secs., and 4th in 24.6 secs.

Scotch won three of the four 4 x 100 relays, U 17 and U 16 both set new records of 43.6 and 44.0 secs respectively. The open boys, after two awful changes, still won in 43.3 secs., with good changes, these boys could have easily broken the A. P. S. record of 42.7 secs.

In the Hurdles, Andy Wardlaw, who had been injured for several weeks, took 5th place in open with 16.2 secs. Mike Thompsn ran 4th in U 17 in 16.1, Geoff Bell won in 12.6 secs., and had hit the tape while the rest of the field were still at the last hurdle; Mal Hiort, after hitting a hurdle early, ran 4th in 12.8 secs.

In the distance events, Scotch proved themselves to be the best school although Xavier were certain they were. In the 800m races, Don Strickland came 2nd in 1-55.1 secs., Rog Tallent 2nd in 1-59.5, Rog Bayley 2nd in 2-1.6 secs, and Dick Fay 3rd in 2-7.6 secs.

The 3000m proved to be one of the most exciting races of the day. Conellan of Xavier took the lead early, and lead the field round while Cochrane was content to sit well back. Cochrane slowly moved through the field and at the start of the bell lap sprinted past Conellan to take the lead, but was overtaken again in the back straight. The two entered the straight neck and neck, but Cochrane surged ahead to beat the tiring Conellan in a time of 9-03.0 (after running a 62 sec last lap).

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Nursing an injured leg, and still recovering from the 3000m ~~struggle~~ Cochrane put up a great struggle in the 1500m, but could only manage 4-15.8, well below his best. Rog Tallent was tired for his 1500m, and could only run 8th, but he has a lot of potential with his 800m time and running the fastest time in the U 17 400m heats (51.6 secs)

The 4 x 800m relay (Strickland, Woodard, Shirrefs, Mc Kinnon) smashed the A. P. S. record with 7:56.4 secs, but were beaten by a good Carey team who ran 7:56.1 secs. Don Strickland, in his second 800m ran 1:57.5 secs., and the others all ran 2 mins or under. Dave Lee, emergency, was very unlucky to miss out on the relay - he ran 2: 1 sec., in a run off for the relay, but was beaten by the others.

The field games were once again strong, Michael Telford took 7th in Open Shot Put, a bit disappointing, Cooper gained 2nd in U 17, then won U 16 Shot Put. Unfortunately, he could only just break the record by a few inches with 48' 11 3/4", he had been doing over 52' before the Combined.

In the High Jump, Jim Mc Kee won U 17 with 5' 11" but lost his U 16 at 5'10" on a countback. In U 15 Peter Sherwen jumped 5'6" for third place.

In the Long Jumps, we gained a First, a second and a third and a fourth. Simon Tallent 3rd with 21'3", Mc Conchie 1st with 20' 11 1/2", Hilliard 2nd 20'6", Peter Brown 4th, 18'3 1/4".

Overall, it was a great days performances by Scotch. Our hopes look good again next year - U 17 and particularly U 16 are very strong, and with adequate preparation we should be in for another win next year.

### TEAM REPORTS

B GRADE An impressive win over Williamstown.

Two in a row for B Grade and plenty of good performances to boot. Captain Jim Grant on the sidelines with some leg injury so this week we had a non-playing coach.

Roger Glass was the success story of the day. Two PB's and a record. His win in the hammer ( 147'12 ) wiped Bob Grant's long standing 1956 record out of the books and the shot ( 44' 11<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> ) was another PB and 6 big points. Andy Jamieson earned his 6 points walking but Bruce Moore— mind far away on a five thousand word essay did not beat the bell and DNQ. The 400m hurdles and long jump clash but Lyndon Langan fitted them in for a hurdles first ( 60.0 ) and a long jump loss ( 21'1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> ). Then a short hurdles win ( 15.9 ) later in the day made LL's personal credit two victories. Ro Hodges was not so fortunate -- 2 nd. over a lap of

three foot hurdles but then after one leap with a pole disaster-- a sprained ankle and Ro was out for the rest of the comp. By the time of the 200m we were up 19 points but the Willy sprinters are swift. Mike Purnell, Hamish Ewing and Greg Evans could only manage 3, 4 and 6 --- lead out to 13 and further docked when nobody turned up for the jav. Ewen Wilson tuned up for the 800m and broke the tape to the cheers of the hill, ( I-53.5 ). Pacemaker Graham Wise ( I-55.2 ) was just pipped by Williamstown ace Terry Phelen and newcomer Don Strickland, in his debut run battled on well up the last straight for 4 th. place ( I-57.6 ). Pete Wardlaw dipped out with a high jump count back ( 5'6" ) and a relay loss still left us 22 up. A win a certainty and Andy Kelso - a fast finishing 16-30.2 and Charlie Aitken ( I6-36.2 ) took the honours over 5000m to seal Willy's fate.

C GRADE A win but still plenty of holes to plug.

Every event we competed in we held or won but what happens when the opposition has a full team against our gaps? Wanted... a hammer thrower, javelin hurler, pole vaulter, high jumper and shot putter. Would you believe field games are not our strong point. John Bradbury was the only brave to try a long--even his heroic battle was not good enough. Scoring events were the track battles.

400m hurdles was a win to Captain Greg Evans (61.0) and John Thorpe showed real G and D. Approaching the last straight a sneaky hurdle leapt off the track to snare Johnny's trailing leg, a desperate attempt to free himself from the black and white monster our hero tried a grace, forward one and a half summersault with pike but the landing was not so graceful-- flat on his face, ouch, arms and legs everywhere, but the brave lad ran on to qualify -- 3rd. place, 3 points and a standing ovation.

Our luck had changed, spurred on by the previous event the 800m runners went to the line. Evans, Watson and Handasyde against a strong Old Xavs combination. A slow first lap, bunched field and boxed in with 200m to go. Down the last straight, a mad sprint to the tape and we had triumphed. Stew first 2-02.3, Nigel 3rd. -- just pipped by Peter Bruce, 2-03.1 (PB) and Dave 4th. 2-03.9. Another newcomer Steve Anderson showed a clean pair of heels over the high hurdles (16.2) and with Ro Hodges in 2nd. place we shot ahead. A relay win and the 5000m sealed the fate. Tarks Oehr who has been shooting Fe<sup>+</sup> for the past month began to reap the benefits, a PB 16-08 and both opponents lapped in the process. Your correspondent put on a burst over the last 2 laps to show Jim Grant he wasn't completely hopeless even after an exhausting 800 m, and passed Old Xavs on the last lap. Where are all our distance runners??

D GRADE - A close result depending on the judges knife.

The walk was a bit of a mix up-- Ian Handasyde didn't really know whether he was coming or going after being pushed around by the judges and although winning the walk well may have lost 10 points from the team total in the process ( Pete Lucas is looking into the matter ). No-one in the field games-- predictable after the C grade debacle-- so we had quite a leeway to make up.

Rob Ward breasted the tape in the 200m (24.2 PB) closely followed by Phil ' I put on 4 pounds last week' Barton (24.4) and Eddy Dawson (4 th.). Rob shows the benefit of Ken Dons coaching even while flat out for Matric exams. Have you ever seen a beaming bummy or a happy hare, well Steve ' boy am I happy' Hare busted his long jump PB with a graceful 18'9 $\frac{1}{2}$ " for a big six points.

800m success was continued with Stu Facey's win (2-7.1), Steve Hare in yet another event 4th. (2-8.2) and John Thorpe out for more punishment, covered in red muck brought up the rear. Pete Wardlaw tried his hand over high hurdles for a win (17.2) and Eddy ' marathon' Dawson filled the 3rd. possie. Even the combined talents of Hare, Barton, Hare and Dawson was not enough to win the relay. Then the 500m to top off the day. Stu Facey and Dave 'I'll give it a go' Evans found their previous exertions in the 800m --take note Jim-- and had to pull out to save their poor bodies from a fate worse than death.

SUB JUNIOR

Even with the pathetic turn out which we had, a gallant team of five courageously fought on to overpower the strong Old Melbourne Grammer opposition. There were many good results recorded. After missing out on the hammer and walk we took the lead after the 200m with a first, Dak Mitchell (23.3-- UI6 record b 0.8 and PB), second Craig Hilliard 23.5 (record by 0.5 and PB) and 3rd. Andy Wardlaw 23.8 ( record by 0.3 and PB).

In the jav. Jimmy McKee had a walkover ( 121'3" PB) and he also took the shot later with a 33'4 $\frac{1}{4}$ " put. 800m and Dak turned his attention to a new event --4th. in 2-23 (PB) and Bruce Hooley who was supposed to be injured trotted in 5th. Long jump was won by Craig Hilliard (18'5") and thus gained a 6-3 advantage. The relay was a one-sided affair when O.M.'s couldn't field a team and we cruised to a 6-0 win. Over all the team performed well winning 61-37.

COMMENT ON TRAINING from Juha Vaatainen ( winner of both 5,000m and 10,000m at the 1971 European games -- NB in these races an unknown named Lasse Viren also from Finland finished 17th. in the 10,000m and this year Viren became the greatest Distance runner of all time with the 5,000m and 10,000m double at the Olympics. Vaatainen is the coach and training partner of Viren and is most probably a better runner but was injured during the Olympics.) Anyway his comment.....

" I know there are many coaches that discuss training schedules with their proteges so that the athletes understand the rights or wrongs about training , and can see the commonsense in the schedules BUT there is the danger that many coaches can be dogmatic about their methods without the young athlete really understanding what he is doing and why. My coach and I worked on the first approach BUT with me planning the basic work ..... then we both went over the plan and discussed it. "

WHO IS THE GREATEST MILLER (OR 1500m) RUNNER THAT THE WORLD HAS KNOWN?????

To find the answer the gold and silver medallists from the 1956, 1960, 1964 and 1968 games were lined up in a computer match race.

The field is :

- Ron Delany- Ireland, 1956 Gold Medallist.
- Klaus Richtzenhain- Germany, 1956 Silver Medallist.
- Herb Elliot- Australia , 1960 Gold Medallist.
- Michele Jazy- France, 1960 Silver Medallist.
- Peter Snell - New Zealand, 1964 Gold Medallist.
- Josef Odlozil- Czechoslovakia, 1964 Silver Medallist.
- Kip Keino- Kenya, 1968 Gold Medallist.
- Jim Ryun- 1968 Silver Medallist (USA).

How was the computer program devised? A hard core of figures were researched-- they included the recorded performances of the 10 best 1500m metres runners for each year over the past 15 years, thus the % improvement over the world generally could be calculated and an appropriate % was subtracted from the recorded performances of all the 8 competitors. Other factors included are-- speed stamina and consistency . Speed in terms of each runners maximum 100m time over the last 100m of a 1500m race. Stamina was concerned with their reputed staying power and consistency was considered relative to their known ability to produce repeatedly good performances. Also "randoms" were introduced to account for normal competitive hazards such as an athletes fitness on the day or the jostle of a particular race. All this type of data and much more to reduce experimental error was fed into a computer operated by Basic Computers Ltd.- a British firm. This data was computed for all stages of the race so the complete pattern of the whole race could be calculated . WHO DO YOU THINK WILL TAKE THE FIRST THREE PLACES???

Laps one and two will be described in the following report but you lucky people out there in OS news-sheet lan will have to wait till next weeks edition of the news-sheet to find out what happens in the last 2 laps --- meanwhile speculate a little, but there is no bookmaker operating on the event-- this is to be the first amateur computer race.

COVER NOW TO MUNICH STADIUM FOR A DIRECT REPORT ON THE EVENT-----

This is Desmond Marwood reporting from Munich's magnificent Olympic Stadium. The brightly coloured seats are practically obliterated by the capacity crowd of spectators. The Olympic flame burns brightly on its cobbled mound on top of the stadium, opposite that famous covered roof. The September sun is glinting on the acrylic glass and floods the centre of the arena where officials and competitors gather for the start of this 1500m computer race. Race conditions are ideal , and as most of the competitors have now removed their tracksuits, I hand you over to Harold Abrahams for a commentary on this memorable event.....

Harold Abrahams speaking.... an almost silent crowd of more than 60,000 wait as the 8 greatest 1500m runners of all time line up for the start of the race on the far side of the stadium, with just over 100 metres to the first bend. On the outside Kip Keino, then Jim Ryun, Klaus Richtzenhain, Peter Snell, Michele Jazy, Herb Elliot, Josef Odlozil and Ron Delany. 'Set' Theres a break! I think it was Jazy ... on their marks again.....'Set!' 'BANG!' They're away!

LAP 1 : Keino goes straight into the lead , followed by Snell and Elliot, and that's the order as come to the first bend. At 200m metres, Keino has a lead of five yards with Elliot and Snell together together. I made the time just outside 27 seconds, very fast indeed. Up to the finish line with three laps to go , its Keino still about five yards ahead of Snell and Elliot . Then a gap of say, four yards and then Jazy... another couple of yards , Odlozil and the German Richtzenhain, with Ryun running very easily... perhaps a bit too easily.. in seventh place and Delany last. Just passing 400 metres- I made the time 55.6 seconds. Oh, I see the big official digital clock shows 55.83 seconds. This is World record pace. Keino wants to open up as big a gap as possible because he knows he cannot match the finishing power of Elliot, Ryun and Snell.

LAP 2 Into the second lap..no change at the moment..Keino still increasing his lead slightly, Snell chasing him, Herb Elliot is dropping back a little into third place just ahead of Jazy and Ryun. As they pass the finish line with 2 laps to go its Keino, with Snell 10 yards back..then another 5 yards and Ryun, Elliot and Jazy. Richtzenhain, Odlozil and Delany are really out of the race. 800 metres in about 1-55 - its 1-54.66 on the clock.. that's half a second faster than Keino's time in the Mexico final. Ryun is at Snells shoulder, still 10 yards behind Keino, with Elliot fifth, just behind Jazy.

AND THIS IS THE END OF THE FIRST TWO LAPS WAIT TILL NEXT WEEK FOR THE CONCLUDING STAGES OF THE RACE.

You may be wondering just how noteworthy performances are selected. Naturally it is a somewhat arbitrary process but the criteria on which selection is (nominally at least) based are as follows -

1. Was the performance a club record?
2. Was it a personal Best performance?
3. If the performance does not fill either of these criteria other considerations are invoked, such as - was it 'close' to a club record? Was it noteworthy in some other way e.g. done despite a fall during the race.

# MUNICH REPORT

## A NOTE ABOUT THE AUTHOR, RICK DILLON

Rick is now at Cambridge University (Pembroke College) on a Shell post-graduate award. He is, so rumour says, Secretary of their athletics club. Until the 1971/72 season he was our A Grade captain, competing in the high jump and sprints - this may explain some of the comments he makes in this most absorbing report!

MUNICH AND THE XXTH OLYMPIAD / Rick Dillon

### PART ONE

Thomas Mann once described Munich as "a city with an open heart, artistic freedom and human kindness". The ruins of 1945 didn't change that and neither will the terrorists of 1972. Indeed what was wartime rubble in 1945 is today the lovely green hill next to Olympiapark.

Munich has become a favourite city of mine, and Bavaria and the Alps a favourite area. The fascinating and eventful history of this city, the capital of the German Free State of Bavaria, dates back 1000 years. Today it provides endless striking contrasts between the 1970s and these past centuries.

I first saw Munich exactly one year before the Opening Ceremony of the XXth Olympic Games. There was no Underground then, and apart from the already completed tower, Olympiapark was a mass of excavations, empty shells and growing buildings. Yet in spite of the colossal amount of work in progress everywhere in the city, there was no disguising the beauty and quality of the city. It was then that I started to love Munich.

The University was founded in 1472 (about 120 years after Cambridge), which was about the time the dominating Frauenkirche was built. There are classical buildings dating from the days of Ludwig I, as well as wide, clean, colourful pedestrian streets lined with modern tastefully decorated department stores. These pedestrian plazas are the coming thing and are already numerous in the cities of Europe and Scandinavia. Shopping in Munich is excellent but never cheap. The beautiful Nymphenburg Palace, the venue for the Olympic Dressage, lies right in suburban Munich. There is also the world renowned Deutsches Museum, plus breweries, car factories, the Opera House and a tram system which really works. Munich does have a traffic problem, but it is striving to solve it with an efficient public transport network. It is interesting to note that tickets for journeys are bought automatically on a system of honesty. This city of 1,400,000 built its underground especially for the Games. The Victorian Government would do well to send its experts to Munich to learn what is required in public transport today.

Bavaria is a land of rich green farming country, of blue lakes and picturesque mountains, of beer, beerhalls and proud traditions. In both village and city many of the people were wearing their colourful and distinctive local costumes - quite a sight for we tourists. We had accommodation at Bad Tetz, a beautiful medieval town some 32 miles south of Munich in the foothills of the Alps. Once the Nazis had a concentration camp there, but today it is a quiet resort for the retired, the old, and the infirm. The locals swear by the health giving properties of the town's mountain spa, and early each morning most of them were out on the pavement with their glasses walking down to it for a drink. It seemed that most of the

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the AUstralian guests at the Olympic Games were living in this area and in fact Geoff Thomas (the Carey coach) was staying just around the corner from us.

This was the atmosphere in which the XXth Olympiad started, I, in fact, arrived two days after the opening ceremony, after a 2½ day train trip from Moscow. After 44 sleepless hours I was glad to reach Bad Tetz and meet up again with Peter Suffren (of MUAC) and a friend of his. Peter had driven to Moscow with me, but had then driven down to Munich while I stayed in Russia for a conference. This meant we had a car, so that the distance from our guest house to Olympiapark shrunk to 1¼ hours by autobahn and underground, and we reckoned this gave us the best of both worlds.

### PART TWO    IMPRESSIONS OF THE GAMES

I do not want to give a chronological list of events and results, either track and field or anything else. I am sure many of you remember these details better than I can anyway, and besides, if I were to attempt such a comprehensive report the club might be forced to raise subscriptions again to pay for publication! Neither do I propose to touch on the politics of the two major troubles with which these Games were afflicted.

How successful a fortnight was it? Criticism was levelled at the soft springy Recortan track, yet 23 Olympic records and 11 world records were set at the Games in track and field competition. In fact the track was probably better for the longer races, although there were several factors against a reproduction of the 9.9 and 19.8 of Mexico. For the competitors, there was a first class village and training facilities which must have made all Aussies present green with envy. No less than seven Recortan tracks were laid in the Munich metropolitan area for the Games, three in Olympiapark. For the spectators there were magnificent stadia which offered superb views of the action, were quickly and easily reached by bus, train, tram and Underground, and were emptied equally quickly. For the visitor there was a full program of cultural (and

other) relaxation to supplement the excitement of the sports events.

For the visitor there was, then everything. For anyone who cared to pass that way a fascinating day could be had overlooking the breathtaking Olympiapark and the stadia, with feverish crowds both inside and out, by walking by the lake, or resting on the fine lawns beside one of the man-made streams, or climbing to the top of the man-made hill for a free panoramic view (instead of queuing for hours to go up the tower). The organisation and administration seemed first class, and the publicity and tri-lingual presentation was excellent, ~~as~~ was the weather - apart from the final 26 hours.

On the debit side were the usual gripes about the very ideals of the Olympic movement, and the terrorist attack. But what could have been done about these? There was some mumbling about science removing part of the atmosphere, and there was the usual stuff from the American negroes, with its companion arguments about victory ceremonies and national anthems. One minor criticism of mine is that too often medal presentations took place at crucial times during other events still in progress.

Apart from the full track and field program, we saw some basketball, cycling, men's gymnastics, and show-jumping. The gymnastics in the magnificent Sports Hall was particularly good. The marching music played while groups changed from one exercise to another produced splendid spectator participation, while the speed with which scores were shown on the electronic indicators made the atmosphere much more exciting than is usual for those sports in which judges have to award a points score.

Athletics But now to the athletics, which commenced on the first Thursday. Straightaway something seemed odd - no judges, no timekeepers. Only cameras and mirrors. Perhaps this detracted from the usual atmosphere, but linked to the two large scoreboards it provided a splendid service for both competitor and spectator. Similarly there was an initially disturbing lack of officials with long tapes on the field. In a sense these Games belonged to science, and the changing times were well exemplified by the best viewing accommodation in all stadia being the domain of international press, radio and television. This treatment extended to the plush deeply carpeted telephone rooms, bars and lounges provided for them. (Regrettably your corespondent was excluded.)

The nine days of athletics were nothing less than a disaster for Australia. Yet Raelene was outstanding. Looking bigger around the backside than I have seen her before, and no fitter, she was twice beaten by a great athlete. But in my opinion Raelene is the best natural woman sprinter in the world, and would have won both these races with a bit more hard work - I think after her memorable second in the 200 she realised this herself. As she left the track she made an uncomplimentary gesture to her team-mates in the stand who had given her a cheer, and then proceeded to cry her eyes out right through the victory ceremony. If there is one thing besides speed it is character.

It is not for me to say what is wrong with our athletics : after this debacle there should be a lot of far better qualified people than me to find a solution. After a year in England I think I can say the same sort of problem needs to be solved here. What I can say though and want to stress here, is that to win international races the most necessary attribute is SPEED. It does not matter whether the race is 100m or 10,000m. Valeri Borzov looks a better 200 runner than a 100 runner, but he had the speed to win the latter, Dave Woxttle produced a dazzling burst of speed to win the final of a most disappointing 800 series, ~~he~~ and Laspe Visen had to outsprint a fast Puttemans over the last lap of their world record 10,000m. Watching the 800's I was very sorry Ralph wasn't out there.

Everyone seems to have commented on these being such a bad Games for the U.S. athletes, and a friend of mine who saw both the Olympics and the U.S. selection trials at Oregon even opined that the latter was the better meeting both for atmosphere and performance. But let's take nothing from those who were successful : the Russians, the Germans of both sides and the Finns. We passed through Finland

DAVE EVANS STARS AGAIN Old Scotch athletes are so dedicated to victory that they forget their own identity. A week or two ago Greg Evans and Dave Evans competed in the same race. They reported to the results lady in the following way - Greg "G? Evans..."; Dave (who came second) said "G. Evans...". MUNICH REPORT Part Four THE WOMEN'S EVENTS AND THE FINAL AFTERNOON

By our roving European correspondent, Richard Dillon

Amongst the girls there were many great performances also. Apart from the ~~mentioned~~ aforementioned sprints (Part Two) the events to stand out were the pentathlon and the tremendously popular win of Britain's 33 year old Mary Peters; the high jump with the fine overall standard achieved by the floppers; the 800; and the three consecutive world record 1500 runs by Bragina. At the end of the Games the 14 women's events had yielded 12 Olympic records and no less than 7 world records. It was this almost unbelievable general improvement which made the task facing gallant performers like Charlene Rendina and Jenny Orr so difficult. And this is why it is essential that Australia must help its coaches to obtain the most up-to-date top international knowledge if we are to again make our presence felt on the track. We do not lead the field here as we do in swimming - we must learn from those who do.

Although the final afternoon contained but nine events it was what everyone was waiting for - the climax of the Games. This absorbing afternoon's athletics showed that a program does not have to be long to be attractive, nor need it be cluttered with races.

It was most disappointing that the weather should break just as the high jumpers were starting to look good, at about 7'2". At this stage both Iarnac and the East German looked very impressive, but the latter seemed to be favouring a leg. Although it was Iarnac who produced a beautifully controlled 7'3<sup>3/4</sup>" clearance to win in difficult conditions, I thought it was Junge who showed the potential of a world record breaker. It was refreshing to see both these athletes adopting a classic straddle technique, and showing that this is still the best jump - if you can do it.

The next day Monday 11th September we returned to a transformed main Stadium for the Prix des Nations - the show jumping teams competition - followed by the Closing Ceremony. The atmosphere in which this usually festive occasion was conducted accurately reflected the change in mood which came over the whole city after the murder of the Israelis. As a mark of respect, all the singing and dancing had been omitted from the program: it would have been hypocrisy to include it.

Yet even so, those blind words of the Official Guide - written of course before the Games - still ring true: "without these Games the world would be this much poorer."





